1850s

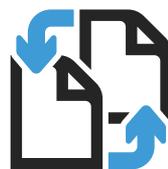
Railroads use telegraphs to communicate with Western Union via Morse code

American National Standards Institute (ANSI) creates Accredited Standards Committee (ASC) X12 to regulate electronic data interchange (EDI)



2001

ASC 12 works with UN/EDIFACT Working Group (EWG) to standardize global EDI requirements
